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## CHAPTER 1

### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE SUCCESSION DUTY ORDINANCE."

(Assented to June 15, 1928.)

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1.

"The Succession Duty Ordinance," Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1923, is hereby amended by adding thereto the following sub-section immediately after sub-section 4 of Section 7 of the said Ordinance:

5. Personal property of a non-resident deceased person (except tangible personal property having an actual *situs* in this Territory) shall not be subject to the duty imposed by this Ordinance if a like exemption is made by the laws of the country, province, state, or territory of the deceased's residence in favour of residents of the Yukon Territory.

Reciprocal provision for exemption on intangible personal property of non-residents.

2.

The Table of Percentages referred to in Section 8 of the said Ordinance is hereby amended by adding the word "grandchild" after the word "grandmother" in the first line of the heading to column 2 of the said Table of Percentages.

## CHAPTER 2

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### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE ASSESSMENT ORDINANCE."

*(Assented to June 15, 1928.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

#### 1.

Section 60  
repealed.

Section 60 of the Assessment Ordinance, being Chapter 5 of the Consolidated Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1914, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:

60. When any lands and improvements become liable to be sold for rates in respect thereto unpaid the Assessor may proceed in the following manner:

1. He shall prepare a copy of the list of lands to be sold, as authorized by this Ordinance, showing the respective owners thereof and the amounts of taxes due thereon, and shall include therein in a separate column a statement of the proportion of costs chargeable on each lot for advertising, and the sum of fifty cents for each parcel to be sold, and shall cause said list to be posted in a conspicuous place in his office at Dawson, and in three places within the town or area for four weeks before the day fixed for said sale. He shall also publish once a copy of the said list in one or more newspapers published in said town or area, and if no newspaper is published in said town or area, then in the newspaper published nearest thereto. The publication of the said list shall be at least four weeks before the day fixed for the sale. The said list shall be headed as follows:

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following lands in the.....will be offered for sale for arrears of taxes on the.....day of....., 19...., at.....o'clock in the.....noon, at.....

2. Such posting and publication shall constitute good and effective service of the said notice upon all persons named therein. Posting and publication to be good service.

3. At the time and place appointed for such sale the Assessor by himself or his agent shall proceed to sell such property at public auction to the highest bidder therefor. Sale of property.

4. Upon the sale of such property to such bidder the Assessor shall deliver to the purchaser a receipt for the price paid therefor in Form "G" in the second schedule to this Ordinance. Receipt to purchaser.

2.

The said Ordinance is further amended by repealing Section 65 thereof and substituting the following therefor: Section 65 repealed.

65. No application for an order for confirmation of a sale of lands or improvements for taxes made under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be heard by a judge until three months after the sale. Notice of such application may, with the permission of the judge, be given by one publication in a newspaper published in the town or area within which such lands are situate, or if no newspaper is published in said town or area, then in the newspaper published nearest thereto, and at such a time in advance of the day on which the application is to be made as the judge shall direct. In such notice the names of all persons appearing by the records of the Land Titles Office to have any interest in the said lands or improvements shall be set forth. 2. The application to confirm a tax sale made under this Ordinance may be made by the Assessor making the sale, the Legal Adviser or any person interested in the sale. The notice shall be given by summons of the judge obtained *ex parte*.

Section 15

The said Ordinance is further amended by adding immediately after the word "income," at the end of Section 15 of the said Ordinance, the following: "Provided that nothing in this section shall be deemed to apply to any vessel or barge of foreign registry."



# CHAPTER 3

## AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE YUKON GAME ORDINANCE."

*(Assented to June 15, 1928.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1.

The Yukon Game Ordinance, being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of 1920, is hereby amended by striking out the words "provided that no such close season so established and declared shall extend beyond the fifteenth day of November, 1927," in sub-section 3 of Section 9 of the said Ordinance, as enacted by Section 5 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1924.

Limitation on close season abolished.

2.

The Yukon Game Ordinance is further amended by striking out the words "Provided that no beaver shall be hunted, trapped, taken or shot at, injured, molested or killed before the first day of January, 1924," in sub-section 2 of Section 1 of the said Ordinance, as enacted by Section 1 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1923.

Subsection 2 of Section 1 amended.

3.

~~Section 4 of said Yukon Game Ordinance is amended by adding thereto the following as sub-section 9:~~

(9) No one person shall have the right to kill in any one year more than six bears.

Not more than six bears to be killed by one person in year.

## CHAPTER 4

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### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE AIR TRAFFIC ORDINANCE."

*(Assented to June 15, 1928.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1.

Air Traffic Ordinance repealed.

"The Air Traffic Ordinance," being Chapter 1 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1927, is hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 5

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### AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND "THE SALE OF BEER ORDINANCE."

*(Assented to June 15, 1928.)*

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, enacts as follows:

1.

Subsection (p) of Sec. 2 amended.

Sub-section (p) of Section 2 of "The Sale of Beer Ordinance," being Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1925, is hereby amended by striking out the words "Provided that during any hours when the Government Liquor Store is not open for business the Licensee" in the fifth, sixth and seventh lines of said sub-

section, and substituting the words " Provided that any Licensee" in lieu thereof.

2.

Sub-section 3 of Section 15 of said Ordinance is amended by numbering it sub-section 5 and inserting it immediately after sub-section 4 of said Section, and is further amended by striking out the word " said " in the second line thereof, and substituting the words " any licensed " in lieu thereof.

Subsection 3 of Section 15 amended.

3.

Sub-section 4 of Section 15 of said Ordinance is amended by numbering it sub-section 3.

Subsection 4 of Section 15 amended.

4.

Sub-section 5 of said Section 15 of said Ordinance is amended by numbering it sub-section 4, and is further amended by adding the words " except as herein provided " after the word " beer " in the sixth line of said sub-section.

Subsection 5 of Section 15 amended.

5.

Section 27 of the said Ordinance is hereby repealed.

Section 27 repealed.

6.

Section 7 of Chapter 2 of the Ordinances of the Yukon Territory, 1926, is hereby repealed.

Section 7 of Chap. 2 of 1926 repealed.

7.

Any disabilities which have been placed upon licensees or premises under the provisions of the above two sections shall cease upon the coming into force of this Ordinance. Provided that any licensee whose license has been cancelled shall have no right to a refund of any portion of the fee paid therefor, and shall be subject in all respects to the general provisions of the said " Sale of Beer Ordinance," should he at any time make application for another license.

Disabilities placed on licensees or premises removed.

8.

Sub-section (a) of Section 2 of said Ordinance is hereby amended by striking out all the words after " which " in the first line of said sub-section and substituting in lieu thereof the words " contains not more than fifteen per cent. proof spirits."

## CHAPTER 6

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AN ORDINANCE FOR GRANTING TO THE COMMISSIONER CERTAIN SUMS OF MONEY TO DEFRAY THE EXPENDITURES OF THE PUBLIC SERVICE OF THE TERRITORY AND THE CITY OF DAWSON.

*(Assented to June 15, 1928.)*

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from G. I. MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Supplementary Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "A" are required to defray certain further expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory and the City of Dawson, and for the purposes relating thereto for the year ending March 31st, 1928; and,

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from G. I. MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory, and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1929; and,

*Whereas*, It appears by Message from G. I. MacLean, Esquire, the Gold Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, and in the Estimates accompanying the same, that the sums hereinafter mentioned in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance are required to defray certain expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson and for the purposes relating thereto for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1929.

The Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, by and with the advice and consent of the Council of said Territory, therefore, enacts as follows:

1. From and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum, not exceeding in the whole one hundred and thirty-seven thousand, eight hundred and sixty-three dollars and ten cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the year ended March 31st, 1928, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance; and from and out of the sums at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall be paid and applied a further sum not exceeding in the whole one thousand, five hundred and ninety-four dollars and eighty-two cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the year ended March 31st, 1928, as set forth in Schedule "A" to this Ordinance.

2. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding on the whole two hundred and thirteen thousand and ninety-eight dollars and sixty-four cents, for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the Yukon Territory for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1929, as set forth in Schedule "B" to this Ordinance.

3. From and out of the funds at the disposal of the Yukon Council there shall and may be paid and applied a sum not exceeding thirty-six thousand and eighty-five dollars and sixty-two cents for defraying the several charges and expenses of the Public Service of the City of Dawson for the twelve months ending March 31st, 1929, as set forth in Schedule "C" to this Ordinance.

4. The due application of all moneys expended shall be duly accounted for.

5. In the event of there being a surplus of moneys standing to the credit of any item voted for Roads, Bridges and Public Works after the construction or repairs provided for have been completed to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of Works and Buildings, such surplus of moneys shall forthwith, on the acceptance of such works or repairs by the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory, be taken from said item and become part of and be added to the amount provided for contingencies to such Roads, Bridges and Public Works, and shall thereafter be at the disposal of the Commissioner of the Yukon Territory for Roads, Bridges and Public Works.

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
